**Building Update** Most of the Museo's work has been behind the scenes this year as we have been working to finalize the architectural plans for the Museo's future home in the historic Ruben's Ice House. When the City's stay-at-home order was issued in March, our scheduled hearing at the Historic & Design Review Commission to receive conceptual design approval for our architectural plans was postponed.
