2021 Texas Freedom Festival



Texas became the first state to make Juneteenth a state holiday in 1980. Last year, numerous states, cities and colleges across the US moved to recognize it as an official holiday. Opal Lee has walked thousands of miles from Fort Worth to Washington, DC, to ensure June 19th – the oldest regular US celebration of the end of slavery – becomes a national holiday. More recently, she started a petition (bit.ly/june-petition) that has since gathered over 1.5 million signatures.
