Rolla Rescue Her Family from Gaza) when Dianne Monroe first wrote us about their situation.

As this new year begins, it SOOO COLD in Gaza! The rain leaks

through the tents at night, as people are trying to sleep. There is bombing everywhere and no such thing as a "safe zone".

This is true for all of Gaza, including Rolla's 21-member family. You have likely read about aid workers and journalists being shot and killed, infants dying of cold, hospitals destroyed with hospital directors and doctors taken away by the Israeli army.

Rolla's family tells her that food is extremely scarce and the prices are beyond imagination. There are very long lines, long waits, to get very basic food like flour or potatoes. People may wait from morning to evening. A can of beans, which used to cost \$5 or \$10, now costs \$30. Five pieces of firewood, for cooking or garmth, costs \$100 and lasts about a day.
